The Congress Venue is located about 15 minutes away (about 800 m) from Barberini (metro subway stop 'BARBERINI-TREVI' – A Line). From the subway stop follow signs indicating 'via del Tritone', then for the Trevi fountain. Once you are arrived to the Fountain, continue in 'via dei Lucchesi' then you will arrive in 'Piazza della Pilotta'. The Congress Centre is on your left. You may also reach the Venue in a 20 min walk (about 1.2 km) from the metro subway stop 'CAVOUR': once you have arrived to the Subway stop, follow indications for via Leonina, then turn right in via del Boschetto. Turn left in via Panisperna and keep walking the way until L.go Magnanapoli, then walk down to via IV Novembre, then the take first road on the right - via della Pilotta - then continue under the arch, as the road will end in Piazza della Pilotta. The Congress Centre is on the right side.
