The unique cyclic change of human endometrial cells are controlled by the harmonious interaction between hypothalamus, pituitary gland and ovaries, thus making the endometrium proliferate, differentiate, exfoliate and then reproduce. Since the sixties, our knowledge on endometrial physiology coupled to biochemical discoveries has allowed the opportunity to modulate and control endometrial changes.
